RE: MORATORIUM ON CLOSURE OF KEMPTVILLE AND ALFRED AGRICULTURAL COLLEGES

Dear Premier Wynne:

As you know, your decision to stand by and allow the University of Guelph to announce it was shuttering agricultural colleges in Kemptville and Alfred was a devastating blow to the agri-food industry, economic development initiatives and the broader rural community in Eastern Ontario.

More than a century of excellence in agriculture education, research and innovation will be ripped from our community if you allow the university's decision to stand.

People are outraged Wednesday's announcement was made without any consultation with the communities affected. This unilateral decision dismissed entirely the importance of these two schools to the future economic growth of our region.

That's why I'm writing to request you put a two-year moratorium on the closure of the Kemptville and Alfred campuses. Doing so will give Eastern Ontario what the University of Guelph's short-sighted and self-interested financial decision didn't – an opportunity to develop a locally based plan to save the two colleges.

As you know, there is a very recent precedent you can follow to put this moratorium in place. In 2012, your predecessor in the Agriculture portfolio, MPP Ted McMeekin, granted a two-year moratorium on closing the New Liskeard Agricultural Research Station.

It is my understanding the stakeholders who came together in New Liskeard when that closure was taken off the table are set to present a business case to your government later this year. I'm asking you to give the people of Eastern Ontario that same opportunity.

I look forward to your positive response and the opportunity to work with you and your government on a made-in-Eastern-Ontario proposal that recognizes how critical these two agricultural colleges are to the future economic prosperity of our region.
